



## CARE for Animals

- **The clinic is only for individuals who make less than \$17,200 a year or to families with an income less than \$25,000 per year. You must bring proof of income (e.g., pay stub, tax return, etc.).** The clinic is free.
- **Priority is given to Little Rock residents.** Others will be admitted only if there are spaces available. You must bring proof of residence (e.g., utility bill, telephone bill, driver's license, etc.). North Little Rock residents can call 501-791-8577 (Sherwood residents call 501-834-2287) to inquire about low-cost pet sterilization.
- **Only a certain number of animals can be seen per clinic, please arrive early. Admittance is on a first come, first served basis.** Get the correct start time by calling 501-603-2273 and listening to the pre-recorded message about the spay/neuter clinics (Option 2). The start time will usually be in the newspaper the week before the clinic. **Please do not rely on word of mouth for the start time, regardless of who tells you! ALWAYS call 501-603-2273 to get the correct time.**
- Pets must be at least 4 months old.
- Pets should have no food or water after midnight on Friday before the surgery.
- If pets have not been vaccinated for rabies, it will be done during surgery for free.
- Limit of 2 pets per household.
- If your dog weighs more than 50 lbs, it is preferable that you call 603-CARE to make other arrangements for the dog to be sterilized instead of bringing the dog to the clinic.
- The clinics are located at Little Rock Animal Services, 4500 South Kramer (just off University Avenue and First Tee Way).
- Please note that the free clinics are funded entirely by private donations and staffed by CARE volunteers. No city funds are used for the clinics. Donations are appreciated.
